Scholarship Application FAQs

- Can I get a scholarship for a master's or doctoral program?
 - Only those eligible for the USS Montana (SSN 794) may receive funds for a master's program. All other scholarships are only available to those pursuing their first associate's/bachelor's/or trade school certification.
- My sponsor served 5 years on active duty and 6 years in the reserves. Am I eligible?
 - No, only active-duty time counts toward the minimum 6 years of Submarine Service or 8 years of Submarine Support Service requirement.
- My grandfather was in the Submarine Force. Can I apply?
 - Currently, the only scholarship available to grandchildren is the USS Nautilus Scholarship for grandchildren of sponsors who served on USS Nautilus (SSN 571/SS 168) or Historic Ship Nautilus.
- I'm an active-duty Sailor. Can I apply?
 - Scholarships for active-duty Sailors are limited to crew members who have served aboard the following submarines: USS Colorado, USS Delaware, USS Hampton, USS Indiana, USS Montana, USS Oregon, and USS Washington. The USS Bowfin Scholarship is also available to those permanently assigned to a command based in Hawaii.
- Can I still receive a scholarship for a part-time course load?
 - Only spouses are eligible to take part-time coursework. They must maintain a minimum course load of 12 credit hours per semester.
- Who completes the application?
 - When starting the application, only the applicant's name and email address should be used.

Scholarship Application FAQs

- I plan to use the Post 9/11 GI Bill. Can I still receive a Dolphin Scholarship?
 - Dolphin Scholarships are the payer of last resort. If there is no financial need, the scholarship will not be awarded.
- My older sibling applied for a scholarship. Do I need to submit all the required eligibility documents?
 - Yes, DSF does not maintain eligibility records from year to year.
- When does my sponsor's submarine service begin?
 - Enlisted time begins the day they class up in BESS. Officer and nuclear-trained enlisted time begins on the first day of Prototype.
- My sponsor does not have their History of Duty Assignments. Can I use a DD-214 in place of this documentation?
 - The requested History of Duty Assignments, in the form of NAVPERS 1070/605 or an Officer Data Card, are REQUIRED. We can also accept Performance Summary Reports and Detachment of Individual Fitness Reports. A DD-214 cannot be used as a substitute in the absence of service records.
- How do I find my sponsor's history of duty assignments?
 - The history of duty assignments is available in the service members' Electronic Service Record or by contacting Navy Personnel Command to request a NAVPERS 1070/605 or Officer Data Card. For more information, visit:

- When should I send my transcript?
 - Transcripts are accepted once Fall semester grades have been posted.
- I'm not ready to go to college. Can I apply when I'm older?
 - Yes, child applicants must be under 24 years of age on March 15th of their application year.
- How do I receive my scholarship?
 - Funds are mailed directly to your school on August 1 and December 1.

Completed applications are due March 15, 2026 at 11:59 P.M. EST.

Meet New DSF Board Member

Mrs. Katherine Pearce endowed the USS Flasher (SSN 613) and VADM Kenneth M. Carr, USN (Ret.), Scholarship with DSF. The USS Flasher was homeported in Pearl Harbor, Hawaii. Pearce, USN, a plank owner on USS Flasher, and VADM Carr, who took command of USS Flasher as her first commanding officer in 1966. VADM Carr was known for his outstanding leadership and genuine concern for the welfare of the USS Flasher's officers, crew, and families.


