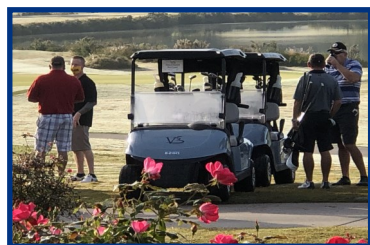

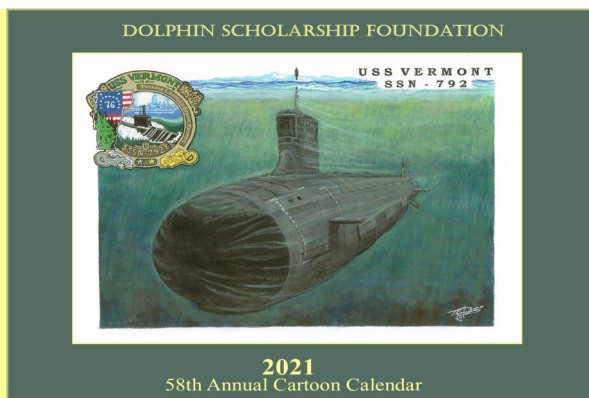

Newly Endowed Scholarships

The Dolphin Scholarship Foundation is excited to announce the endowment of the following scholarships:

REAR ADMIRAL PHIL, NANCY AND TRICIA DAVIS SCHOLARSHIP



Tricia Davis is a Dolphin Scholarship alumni and an active member of the John Haines Society. She is a U.S. Navy veteran who served five years as a Surface Warfare Officer, and deployed abroad on two nuclear powered aircraft carriers, USS NIMITZ and USS CARL VINSON as a nuclear trained Surface Warfare Officer. She holds a Bachelor of Science Degree in Biomedical Engineering from Duke University and a Master's Degree in Public Administration from the University of Washington.

Tricia is currently serving as the Road Services Division Director in the King County Department of Local Services. In her current position, she leads a division with 400 employees that maintains the 1500 miles of roadway and 182 bridges in the unincorporated portion of King County. Previously, Tricia was Deputy Director of the Rail Operations Division and spent nearly 11 years as a budget supervisor in the King County Executive Office. Before joining the County, Tricia worked as an operations analyst at a financial services corporation and a research analyst while in graduate school. In her spare time, Tricia enjoys cycling, swimming, music and cooking. She lives with her husband Jeff Sorrentino in Seattle, WA and their kittens Britt and Matt.

RADM Phil Davis graduated from the United States Naval Academy in 1968 and the Naval Post Graduate School (1969) with an M.S.E.E. He served on 5 submarines, USS POGY, USS DANIEL WEBSTER, XO USS MEMPHIS, CO of USS JACKSONVILLE, and temporary CO of USS GLENARD P. LIPSCOMB. He served a tour in NMPC (Pers 421b), OP-07, major program manager of PMS 402/404 (torpedoes) (5 years), and completed his naval career as PEO SUBMARINES (6 years)/Deputy Commander of Submarines (NAVSEA) (5 years). Following retirement, Phil was a vice president of American Systems Company (ASC) of Chantilly, VA. Since his retirement from ASC, he has been consulting for 10 years with John P. Davis & Associates, LLC. Phil is an avid cook, philatelist, model boat maker, and gardener who also raises honeybees and oysters.

Nancy received a B.A. from Mount Holyoke College and an MLS from the University of Hawaii in 1973. She served as a librarian for 31 years, initially in public libraries in Ledyard, CT and Arlington, VA, and then in school libraries in Portsmouth City Schools (K-3) and Fairfax County, VA (PS-6), including five years at Thomas Jefferson HS for Science and Technology. Since retiring, Nancy remains active as a community volunteer, leading several social justice programs at her church, working with Friends of Burke Centre Library, and the Student Peace Awards of Fairfax County.

MRS. ROSEMARY N. ADKINS SCHOLARSHIP



Rosemary Newman Adkins (1942-2020) was a believer in educational opportunity, a committed member of the submarine community, and a longtime supporter of the Dolphin Scholarship Foundation. The daughter of German immigrants, Rosemary grew up speaking German, harvesting potatoes, and driving tractors on her family's potato farm in Idaho. She excelled in school, graduating as student body president and the valedictorian of her high school class, and hoped to go on to college. But her father thought a college education was a waste of money, especially for women, so Rosemary went to work instead.

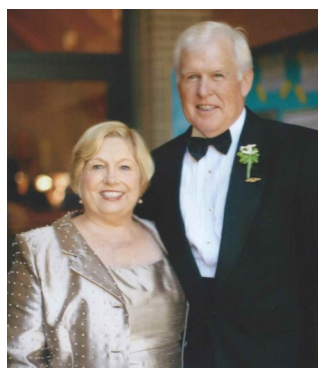
After meeting her future husband, submariner James N. Adkins Jr., Rosemary started down the long path to her college degree. In 1961, she enrolled at Idaho State University, paying her own way. A year later, she transferred to the University of Connecticut. Multiple moves and the raising of two children intervened, but Rosemary persevered, taking classes at The Citadel, the University of Guam, and George Mason University. In 1979, she finally received her Bachelor of Business Administration in Management from the University of Guam, becoming the first and only member of her immediate family to graduate from college.

Across many decades and duty stations, Rosemary was a dedicated Navy wife. She was a superb hostess and adept manager of logistics. She was also a devoted mother and grandmother, who encouraged the educational and professional pursuits of each generation. Through donations and active involvement in wives' club activities supporting the Dolphin Scholarship Foundation, Rosemary also contributed to the education of the larger Navy family.

In 2002, she and Jim retired to Silverdale, Washington, where they lived until 2019, when they moved to a retirement community in Issaquah, Washington. In retirement, they volunteered for local organizations, traveled widely, and enjoyed time with family and friends. Before succumbing to Alzheimer's disease, Rosemary rediscovered her ability to play the piano and spent many hours at the keyboard.

The endowed scholarship bearing her name honors her commitment to educational opportunity, to the Navy community, and to service to others. It is the family's hope that this scholarship will open up to others the educational opportunities Rosemary would have welcomed as a young woman.

ADMIRAL & MRS. RICHARD W. MIES, USN (RET.) SCHOLARSHIP



Admiral Richard W. Mies, USN (Ret.) completed a distinguished 35-year career in the US Navy. He commanded US Strategic Command for four years prior to retirement. As Commander in Chief, he was directly responsible for the command and control of the Nation's strategic nuclear forces supporting the national security objective of strategic deterrence.

Admiral Mies has a unique breadth and depth of operational and policy experience in undersea and strategic warfare. He has held both US and Allied commands at senior military levels. After completing training for submarine duty, he served on two nuclear attack submarines and a ballistic missile submarine before commanding the nuclear attack submarine, USS SEA DEVIL. He subsequently served in a wide range of distinctive command positions including Commander Submarine Development Squadron

TWELVE, Commander, Submarine Group EIGHT and Commander, Allied Submarines, Mediterranean, and Commander, Submarine Force, U.S. Atlantic Fleet and Commander, Submarine Allied Command, Atlantic.

Admiral Mies is one of a few flag officers to complete qualification as both a submariner and naval aviation observer. In addition to unit and service awards, his decorations include the Defense Distinguished Service Medal, Navy Distinguished Service Medal, Defense Superior Service Medal (two awards), Legion of Merit (four awards), National Intelligence Distinguished Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal (two awards), Navy Commendation Medal (four awards), Navy Achievement Medal, and Secretary of Energy Gold Medal. Newly Endowed Scholarships (cont'd.)

Admiral Mies is a native of Chicago, Illinois. A distinguished scholar and athlete, he graduated first in his class with highest honors from the U. S. Naval Academy. He holds a Bachelor of Science degree with majors in mechanical engineering and mathematics. An intercollegiate wrestling champion and an all-conference lightweight football player, he was awarded the Thompson Trophy for contributing the most to the promotion of athletics at the Naval Academy. He has completed post-graduate education at Oxford University, England, the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy, and Harvard University. He holds a Masters degree in government administration and international relations; he also holds an Honorary Doctorate of Law degree from the University of Nebraska and was honored as a Distinguished Graduate of the Naval Academy. His professional education includes the Flag Officers' Capstone course, the program for Senior Executives in National and International Security at Harvard University, and the Joint Flag Officer Warfighting course.

Following retirement from the Navy, Admiral Mies served as a Senior Vice President and Deputy Group President of Science Applications International Corporation (SAIC) and as the President and Chief Executive Officer of Hicks and Associates, Inc, a wholly owned subsidiary of SAIC. He presently serves as the CEO and President of The Mies Group, LTD. Admiral Mies served as the Chairman of the Department of Defense Threat Reduction Advisory Committee from 2004-2010 and Chairman of the Boards of the Navy Mutual Aid Association from 2003-2011 and the Naval Submarine League from 2007-2016. He previously served on the board of directors of Mutual of Omaha, McDermott International, Babcock and Wilcox, BWX Technologies, Exelon Corporation, the US Naval Academy Foundation, and the US Naval Institute. He presently serves as the Chairman of the Strategic Advisory Group for US Strategic Command, Vice Chairman of the Secretary of Energy Advisory Board, Co-chair of the Nuclear Energy and National Security Coalition of the Atlantic Council and is a member of the Committee on International Security and Arms Control of the National Academy of Sciences, and the Board of Governors of Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory.

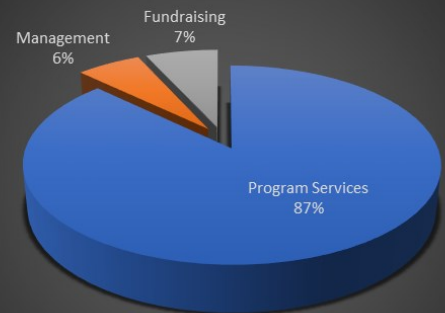
