In Memory

LCDR Alexis Foss Steele, USN

This past September, 2004 Dolphin Scholar and Surface Warfare Officer LCDR Alexis Foss Steele passed away unexpectedly. A leader, mentor and dedicated naval officer, she excelled at building teams—learning from her command leadership while supporting and inspiring her junior officers at sea and on shore. From her deployments to assignments in Surface Forces Pacific and Surface Warfare Officers School Command she thrived on planning, problem solving, and training those coming up the ranks behind her. Alexis was an outstanding example of a Dolphin Scholar—intelligent, driven, and bettering the people and world around her. DSF sends our heartfelt condolences to her family, friends, and community.



Newly Endowed Scholarships

The Dolphin Scholarship Foundation is excited to announce the endowment of its 55th and 56th scholarships:

MARY ANNE WHITE SCHOLARSHIP



A native of California, Mary Anne Landreau was born in Bellflower and raised in Tujunga, one of six children. Growing up in the Great Depression with its many challenges and sacrifices made her appreciate the value of family and friends, something she has carried with her through her entire life.

She attended college at a local college, studying accounting and bookkeeping. She then worked at the telephone company in the accounting department. Her future husband, Steven Angelo White was a good friend of her older brother. They married in January 1951, and she embarked on 34 years of service as a military spouse with all the attendant multiple moves and adaptation to new places and friends that it entailed and the difficulties in raising seven children while her husband was absent on lengthy deployments.

But no challenge was ever too great and she and her family thrived. With each move came fascinating new experiences, from California to Hawaii to the East Coast of the U.S. and Spain, she immersed herself in the local culture, enjoying all that the new duty station offered, from learning and then teaching hula through the CWF/MWR in Hawaii, ceramics in Groton, and throwing pottery in Spain. Throughout her years as a military spouse, she was pro-active in wives' groups at each duty station, and in particular she was very supportive of the younger military wives who were not used to the rigors of raising a family while their husbands were away. She chaired the Dolphin Scholarship Foundation from 1980 to 1983. Later in her husband's career she was a gracious hostess to foreign dignitaries.

From the first assignment of her husband on the USS Manchester (CL-83), to his history-making transpolar crossing in the USS Nautilus (SSN-571), to his final assignments as COMSUBLANT and Chief of NAVMAT, ADM and Mrs. White demonstrated deep love of their country, determined dedication to the Submarine Force, and unwavering support for other Naval families. Widowed in February 2021 after 70 years of marriage, Mrs. White retired to a quiet life in Charlottesville, Virginia where she is a frequent and gracious hostess to her seven children, 35 grandchildren, and 44 great-grandchildren (and counting!).

In Memoriam

Eleonore Bednowicz Rickover

On July 5, 2021, the submarine community lost a long time friend, supporter and member of the DSF Distinguished Advisory Board, Mrs. Eleonore Bednowicz Rickover. She was the widow of Admiral Hyman G. Rickover, father of the nuclear navy. She was the ship's sponsor of the USS Hyman G Rickover (SSN 709) and also sponsored a Dolphin Scholarship in his name for five years.

MYRA “MICKEY” F. KAUDERER SCHOLARSHIP

Mickey Kauderer was born in Brooklyn, New York on January 1, 1935. She graduated from Tilden High School at age 16, worked as an Assistant Buyer in the main office of a major department store chain, and attended Brooklyn College.



At age 19, without any prior exposure to the Navy life upon which she was to embark, she married then Ensign Bernard M. (Bud) Kauderer. It was a perfect fit. Thus, she began her long and successful career as the quintessential ‘Navy Wife’. Through the next 33 years, she followed him from assignment to assignment, often moving cross country and cross ocean, quickly establishing a home to maintain family stability, and to be ready to carry out required official entertainment responsibilities and her leadership role with more junior wives. During the future Admiral’s frequent and long deployments, she provided the loving care, discipline and leadership by example that resulted in the development of three wonderful and accomplished children who have instilled in their families the lessons learned from childhood.

Along the way, in addition to raising her family, and her official duties, Mickey served as an American Red Cross ‘Grey Lady’ volunteer at several military hospitals. She was her older daughter’s Girl Scout leader for three years in Hawaii. Mickey was also active in Hadassah, completing a term as President of her chapter while stationed in Idaho Falls, Idaho. She served as President of the Dolphin Scholarship Foundation from 1983 to 1986.

In 1991, in recognition of her contribution to the leadership of both the Pacific and Atlantic Submarine Forces during her husband’s command of both COMSUBPAC and COMSUBLANT, Mickey was selected by the Secretary of the Navy for the high honor of christening and launching the nuclear attack submarine USS Annapolis (SSN-760). She continues to serve the role of ‘Sponsor’, maintaining close contact with the officers and crew of ‘her ship’.

She happily resides in Carlsbad, California and is the proud great-grandmother of 16 children.

USS Scorpion (SSN 589) Scholarship Endowment Challenge

DSF has received a lead donation of \$17,500 to start a ***USS Scorpion (SSN 589) Scholarship*** in honor of the 99 officers and crew members that perished when she was lost at sea on May 22, 1968. The anonymous donor has pledged to match donations for the remainder of the \$70,000 needed to fully endow the scholarship. This scholarship will be open to children, stepchildren, and spouses whose sponsor has served a minimum of eight years in submarine service or ten years in assignments in support of the submarine force—i.e. submarine groups or squadrons, training and maintenance facilities, and Submarine Tenders. 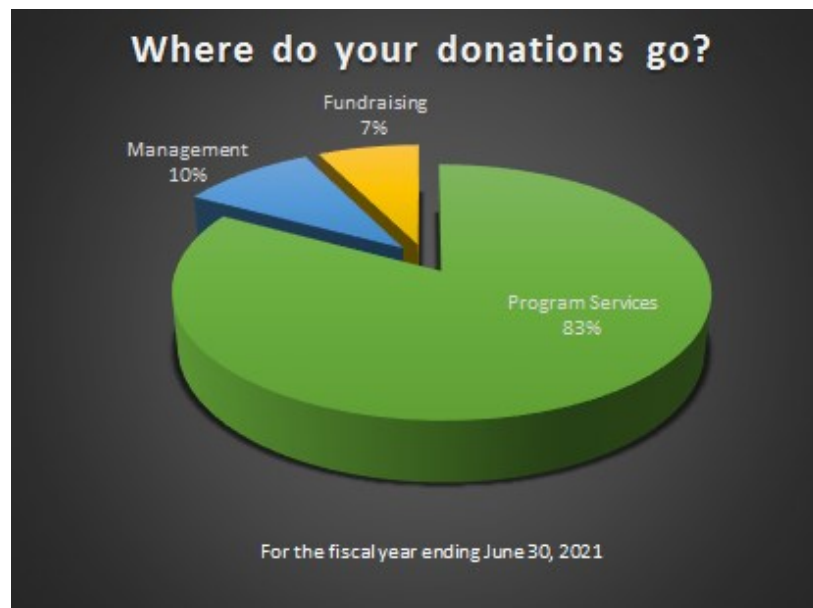

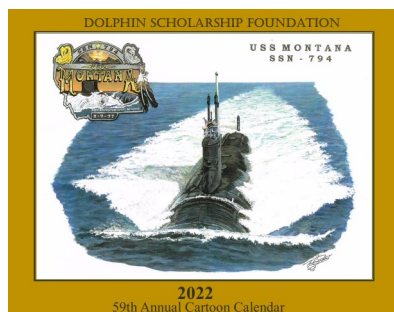

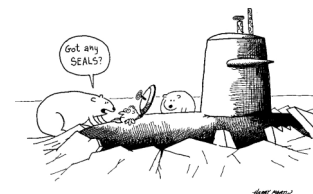
