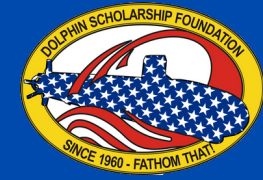


A Brief History Of DSF

Dolphin Scholarship Foundation was established in 1960 and granted the first award of \$350 in 1961 to John L. Haines, Jr.

As the cost of education continues to skyrocket, so does the need for the Foundation to assist students. Scholarships are available, on a competitive basis, to the children, stepchildren, and spouses of current or former members of the Submarine Force or Navy members who have served in submarine support activities. Today, DSF sponsors over 100 ongoing scholarships with annual awards ranging from \$1,500 to \$4,000 per student.

Scholarships are available for two to four years of full-time undergraduate studies as well as trade/vocational certifications. Approximately 30-35 new scholarships are awarded each year.

Sponsor Requirements

Sponsor must be qualified in submarines and served on active duty in the U.S. Submarine Force for a minimum of 6 years.

OR

Sponsor must have served on active duty in submarine support activities for a minimum of 8 years.



Application

In addition to proof of dependency and sponsor qualifications, applications require an essay, work history/extracurricular activities, high school and/or college transcripts, and three recommendations. All documents must be received by March 15.



Administered Scholarships

DSF also administers the following submarine specific scholarships with their own eligibility requirements: Laura W. Bush USS Texas, USS Colorado, USS Delaware, USS Hampton, USS Indiana, USS Montana, USS Nautilus, USS Oregon, and USS Washington.
